What to bring to school:

- PE days are **Tuesday (Greenfinch)** and **Thursday (both)** – children should wear their PE kit into school on these days. Earrings must be able to be taken out or covered. We will be doing PE outside in all weathers so please ensure your child is prepared.
- Named water bottles. (Only water, no juice or squash)
- Reading Record in bag every day along with reading book.



What to bring to school:

UNIFORM

School uniform

- Grey school trousers / skirt/ shorts (any brand)
- White polo shirt (with or without logo) / shirt / blouse
- Royal blue and white summer dresses
- Royal blue sweatshirt / cardigan / jumper - with or without logo
- Grey / white socks or tights
- Black school shoes

PE uniform

- Royal blue t-shirt (with or without) logo
- Black tracksuit bottoms (plain)
- Black PE shorts (plain)
- Black hoody (with or without logo - no other logos, images or patterns permitted)
- Trainers or plimsolls

Other

- PE kits must be worn to school on PE day - Except for Reception
- Hair longer than shoulder length must be tied up at all times and accessories should be fitting with school uniform and functional. Large bows and other accessories are not permitted.
- Earrings must be small, plain studs. These must be removed for PE.



What to bring to school:

Snacks

In Year 3, you will need to bring your own snack for break time.

This should be fresh fruit but alternatives are: rice cakes, bread sticks, crackers or cheese.



You should not bring crisps, chocolate, biscuits or ultra-processed fruit snacks.



Pencil Case

In Year 3, you may choose to bring **one** pencil case.

To make sure we have enough space for learning, your pencil case should not be longer than 20cm or wider than 15m.

Reading:

Children are responsible for changing their reading book within their book band with guidance from an adult after completing an AR quiz. The teacher will explain how to do this.

AR quizzes cannot be accessed from home and will be closely monitored by class teachers. Children will complete STAR assessments half-termly to help us with assigning an appropriate books for them.

Children are expected to be reading for a minimum of 20 minutes at least three times a week (with an adult).

Children need to bring their reading books to school daily so that adults can record their reading in school.

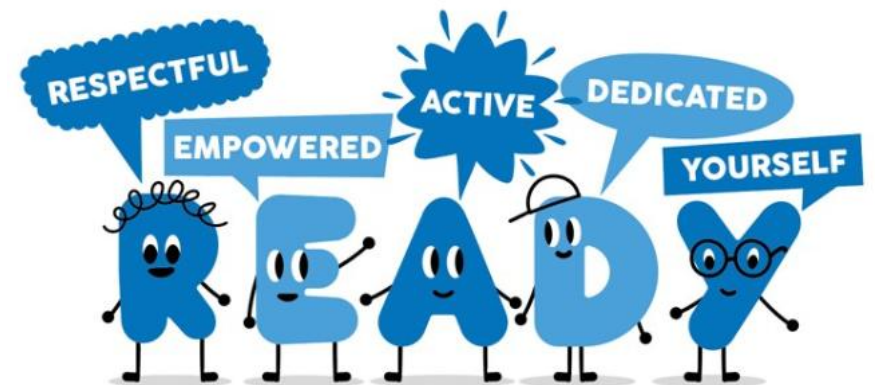


Rewarding Good Attitudes to Learning:
